BRIEF SUMMARY dmh associates selected activities and invitation to international conference, october 2019

Career-Related Learning in Primary Schools: January 2019 saw the publication of a new report "Career-related learning in primary: The role of primary teachers and schools in preparing children for the future" co-authored by Dr Deirdre Hughes OBE, in association with Dr Elnaz Kashefpakdel and Jordan Rehill both from Education and Employers, London.

This paper, commissioned by Teach First in England, provides evidence on the benefits of career-related learning (CRL) activities for children in primary schools, alongside a range of teacher roles. In doing so, the research sets out what primary schools can do to tackle the influence of socio-economic issues that affect children's future transitions. It considers how we can get a step closer to ensure best practice in CRL provision. In line with the Careers Strategy, the


Department for Education, through The Careers & Enterprise Company (CEC), is investing £2 million in developing and extending career-related learning in primary schools. In 2019, this is a hot topic in primary schools linked to strategies for improving social mobility and life chances. Dr Deirdre Hughes and Dr Elnaz Kashefpakdel have jointly written a Book Chapter for a new international publication (Springer Books) to be published later this year. In the meantime, Deirdre is working with Geoff Dunn MBE, Headteacher (Ballysally Primary School), Nick Chambers, CEO, Education and Employers (and his team) to launch Primary Futures in Ballysally Primary School, Coleraine on 21st March 2019. It is hoped through this event to broaden and raise pupils' awareness of the world of work with many volunteers already offering to visit the school to meet with children, parents and teachers. A video will be produced to capture the impact of the activities.

CAREERS WALES - Work Advice Wales



Last year, on behalf of the Welsh Government, Deirdre reviewed international approaches to employability assessment and referral, as part of the Welsh Assembly Government's programme – **Prosperity for All** - https://beta.gov.wales/sites/default/files/publications/2018-10/prosperity-for-all-annual-report-2018.pdf Since July 2018, she has worked closely with Careers Wales to inform and support their ongoing work in preparation for Work Advice Wales, due to launch in April 2019.

In January 2019, Deirdre contributed to a staff training and development programme with senior managers and careers advisers from across Wales. This covered need-based approaches to guidance, assessment and referral, motivational interviewing, and solution-focused approaches to career guidance and coaching working with vulnerable young people and adults. Feedback from these sessions was very positive:

Scottish Government – Careers Strategy

The Scottish Government is developing a new careers strategy with its partners following the earlier published careers strategy 'Career Information, Advice and Guidance in Scotland - A Framework for Service Redesign and Improvement' (Scottish Government, 2011). The Minister for Business, Fair Work and Skills, Jamie Hepburn MSP, signalled his intention for a new careers strategy to be published in September 2019. The new



strategy will look at equity of access to careers information, advice and guidance and quality of service, with a specific focus on adults – both in work and unemployed – ensuring careers provision is both flexible and responsive to the ever changing labour market conditions. A Steering Group will provide strategic oversight to guide the development of the Careers Strategy which will be drafted by the Scottish Government. This strategy will support the ambitions set out in Scotland's National Performance Framework to ensure all people in Scotland are able to fulfil their potential. Dr Deirdre Hughes OBE and Dr Anthony Mann, Senior Policy Analyst at the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) have been appointed by the Scottish Government to act as an Independent Advisers.

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Skills Northern Ireland 2019



In 2015, Deirdre Hughes and the Prospects Events Team co-founded Skills Northern Ireland. Since then, on average 6,581 students per year have attended the annual Skills Shows. Last year, students had an opportunity to engage with 70 exhibitors, including major employers and universities from across the UK. A Senior Advisory Group meeting took place in Belfast in January 2019 to reflect on lessons learned from the 2018 event and to assess impact. Contributors were formally thanked for

their invaluable contributions, particularly the main sponsor Northern Ireland Electricity Networks. A survey of young people's career choices was completed by dmh associates - http://dmhassociates.org/wp-content/uploads/2018/11/DMH-report-skills-061118-FINAL-REPORT.pdf
The aim was to connect with young people in schools and colleges between the age of 14 years old to 19 years old to find out more about their views of the world of work, the opportunities available to them, and what they think their future might look like. Plans are underway to extend this survey in N.Ireland and other parts of the UK in 2019. INSIGHTS TO SOME SELECTED RESEARCH AND EVALUATION PROJECTS

• Building Better Opportunities (BBO) UCan, Dorset

dmh associates have been awarded a major contract to undertake an in-depth evaluation of the Building Better Opportunities (BBO) UCan project in Dorset (February 2019 – December 2019). The programme supports organisations in Dorset to tackle the root causes of poverty, promoting social inclusion and driving employment growth opportunities. It aims to help the most disadvantaged in local communities. Deirdre is programme Director working closely with Chris Percy, Karen Adriaanse, Helen Plant, Robert Hughes and Dr Erika Kispeter (Research Fellow, University of Warwick, IER).

• A rapid evidence review: What enables and drives adults in work to learn new skills? led by CFE Research, Leicester, on behalf of NESTA.

The research team, including Deirdre Hughes, is using behavioural insights to better understand what does or would motivate the target audience of adults in work to undertake training to acquire new skills and knowledge. The ultimate aim is to significantly increase the number of adults (and employers) participating in continuous learning, particularly in digital skills, to ensure a workforce that is fit for the future.



• Testing New Approaches to Engage Young people with Career Information led by the Behavioural Insights Team, supported by the Department for Education, Deirdre Hughes and volunteer schools in the West Midlands region.

This is an innovative project designed to motivate students (in Years 8 and 9) to engage with a wider set of education and career information. The project aims to address some of the current challenges in engaging young people in technical education and careers.

KEYNOTE PRESENTATIONS

Deirdre will be delivering a keynote presentation on 'Towards a Strong Career Learning Environment' at the Careers Live event in Leeds on 19 March 2019. This is followed by a presentation to the People and Places Board, Local Government Association (LGA) in London.

On Monday 25 March 2019, Deirdre is presenting a keynote at the sixth symposium event organised jointly by Edinburgh Napier University, Skills Development Scotland (SDS), and the University of the West of Scotland. The aim of these events is to promote a research culture in the career guidance profession in Scotland. She will focus on 'Social Justice and Evidence-based Practice'.

Deirdre will be meeting with Angela Rayner, Shadow Secretary of State for Education, in the House of Commons on 19 March 2019, with colleagues from Unison, Careers England and the UK Career Development Institute (CDI).
